**First Lesson** Amos 5:6-7, 10-15

Reader A reading from the Book of the Prophet Amos.

Seek the Lord and live, or he will break out against the house of Joseph like fire, and it will devour Bethel, with no one to quench it. Ah, you that turn justice to wormwood, and bring righteousness to the ground!

They hate the one who reproves in the gate, and they abhor the one who speaks the truth. Therefore, because you trample on the poor and take from them levies of grain, you have built houses of hewn stone, but you shall not live in them; you have planted pleasant vineyards, but you shall not drink their wine. For I know how many are your transgressions, and how great are your sins—you who afflict the righteous, who take a bribe, and push aside the needy in the gate. Therefore the prudent will keep silent in such a time; for it is an evil time.

And before him no creature is hidden, but all are naked and laid bare to the eyes of the one to whom we must render an account.

For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sin. The Gospel Mark 10:17-31

As Jesus was setting out on a journey, a man ran up and knelt before him, and asked him, "Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus said to him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: 'You shall not murder; You shall not commit adultery; You shall not steal; You shall not bear false witness; You shall not defraud; Honor your father and mother." He said to him, "Teacher, I have kept all these since my youth." Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said, "You lack one thing; go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." When he heard this, he was shocked and went away grieving, for he had many possessions.

Then Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, "How hard it will be for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!" And the disciples were perplexed at these words. But Jesus said to them again, "Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! The Blessed Constance Ward of the Confraternity of the Blessed Sacrament plays an important part in the prayer life of the St. George's. The associates form an intercessory prayer group, praying for those whose names parishioners have written in the Parish Intercessions list, and lifting up before God other concerns, local and worldwide. Each day, an associate makes these intercessory prayers, usually at St. George's Chapel in the presence of the reserved Sacrament.

The Confraternity of the Blessed Sacrament (CBS) was founded in 1862 as part of the catholic revival in the Church of England. Its aim was to be, first of all, a confraternity of men and women praying and working for a greater devotion to Jesus Christ in the Eucharist, the Sacrament of his Body and Blood. The society has since spread throughout the Anglican Communion. The American branch is governed by a superior-general and a council of regional representatives. Wherever possible, members of CBS meet together in local wards for prayer, worship and mutual support under the guidance of a priest as Ward Superior.
