





Music Notes: Today's anthem text is taken from I Kings 1:39-48. This passage tells the story of Solomon being anointed king to succeed his father King David. This anthem is sung at every coronation ceremony in Great Britain, and was recently sung when Charles succeeded his mother Elizabeth II. The music includes festive arpeggios and grand homophonic choral phrases. The meter changes to triple meter at the words "and all the people rejoiced" to depict dancing at word of the good news. A fast running note line is first sung by the basses, then taken up by the sopranos, then alto + tenor together on this festive Christ the King Sunday.
