# GODLY PLAY SUNDAY SCHOOL PROGRAM

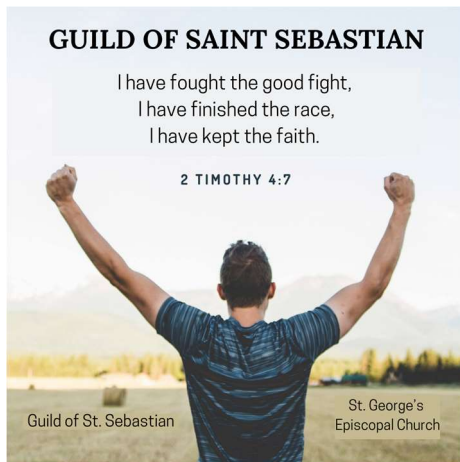
